The conference "Snap elections to the parliament 2023 - will Slovakia follow in the footsteps of Poland and Hungary?" will cover the following three main areas: snap elections in the Slovak Republic within their national context, current international affairs, and historical-political factors affecting political developments in Slovakia and in Central Europe.

- Pre-election campaign, new trends in voter mobilisation;
- Evolution of the party system in Slovakia in the context of the 2023 parliamentary elections;
- Post-2020 socio-economic changes (Covid-19 pandemic, energy crisis) and their consequences for political developments in Central Europe
- Slovakia and the Visegrad Group part of the EU's problematic periphery?
